OFA Student Travel Grant

The Orthopedic Foundation for Animals (OFA), a not-for-profit organization dedicated to improving companion animal health through a reduction in the incidence of genetic disease, is offering a travel grant to one student from each of the U.S. accredited veterinary schools.

Grant Details:

- Coverage: The OFA will cover all conference-related travel expenses, to include travel to Durham (airfare or mileage), any meals not part of the conference, and any other travel related expenses such as airport parking, or transportation to the airport.
- The AKC and the AKC CHF will cover conference registration, and lodging (double occupancy).

This conference is an outstanding opportunity for students to interact and network with fellow veterinary students, veteran dog breeders and club members, practicing veterinarians, canine health research scientists, and professional staff and board members from the OFA, AKC CHF, and Purina.

The conference begins on Thursday afternoon and runs through Saturday evening. Students will have access to all conference sessions, as well as the planned meals, events, and receptions.

On Friday evening, the OFA Board of Directors will host a dinner for all students to familiarize them with the OFA, and the role it plays with the breeder community in breeding healthier dogs.

Grant Requirements

As part of the grant, each selected student will be required to:

- Organize and deliver a conference summary to fellow students upon return
- Each student will receive a \$200 stipend to cover summary-related expenses

Pre-Requisites and Selection

Eligibility

- Must be a full-time student at an accredited U.S. veterinary school
- Selection based on:
 - Academic achievement
 - Experience
 - Involvement in purebred dogs
 - Future veterinary profession interests

- Selection Announcement: June, 2025
